COMPLETING YOUR AUDITION PAPERWORK:

- Please read through this information before filling out your audition form, and keep this sheet for reference.
- All roles are unpaid, and we are only seeking performers who are 18+.
- Fill out the audition form completely, and make sure to answer the question about the part(s) of interest to you.
- <u>Include your resume and/or headshot with this form if you have them available.</u>
- Review the list of characters to see if you are interested in a specific role; the descriptions offer insight as to what the director is seeking, and the vocal range for each character.
- Review the rehearsal schedule and list all potential conflicts that you have during the anticipated rehearsal period on the blank calendar on the back of the audition form by placing an "X" on the conflicting date.
- If you have no conflicts at all during the rehearsal period, please check the "I have no conflicts" box.
- Please be frank about your conflicts they are crucial in finalizing a realistic rehearsal schedule that respects both your time and ours. All conflicts will be noted on a master schedule, and additional conflicts cannot be added after the first rehearsal (outside of emergencies).
- Turn in your completed paperwork to the audition staff when you arrive at your audition. Forms will be available onsite, but please arrive 10 minutes early if you need to complete your form in person.
- Rehearsals will begin Tuesday, October 28th, and take place Tuesdays through Fridays from 7:00 to 10:30 PM, and on Saturdays from 10:00 AM 4:00 PM. If cast, you will be notified of the time & schedule for the first rehearsal no later than Monday, October 27th.

COVID PROTOCOLS:

We're in a new age of theater in this time of COVID. We're delighted to be back at TJ with our audiences and we're aware that everyone's comfort level may vary. At this time, we are proceeding without any specific COVID protocols beyond CDC guidance. THE AUDITION PROCESS:

- Auditions will take place October 21st-23rd from 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM each evening.
- Given our tight schedule, please plan to arrive early for your scheduled audition time (5-10 mins), and please do not expect to be released before the end of your audition time.
- If you cannot attend callbacks, please note this on your audition form.

CALLBACKS:

- Callbacks will be held on **Saturday, October 25th, 2025,** from approximately 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All those invited to callbacks will be notified of all relevant details on or before **Friday, October 24th, 2025**. As our time for callbacks is limited, **please make every effort to be on time, if not early!**
- If you are unable to attend in-person auditions, please email the Producer Allison Gray-Mendes at agraymendes@gmail.com to request audition accommodations.
- Please note, sides from the show will be utilized for callbacks. The creative team will be mixing and matching actors throughout the day, so please be patient and remain flexible throughout your callback!
- Please make sure we can reach you about callbacks at the e-mail address & phone number(s) you provide on your audition form, and please confirm your acceptance of the callback invitation upon receipt.
- If you are NOT called back, this does not mean that you are not being considered for the cast. Certain callbacks may only occur where a choice must be made, necessitating those actors to be seen again. Casting may occur based solely on your initial audition!

AFTER CALLBACKS ARE COMPLETED:

All who come out for auditions will be notified as to whether they have been cast no later than Monday, October 27th, 2025. As a reminder, please be certain that we can contact you at the phone number(s) and/or email address you provide on the audition form; it is important to cast the show in a timely manner for both you and us! Please note that all those cast must become members of The Arlington Players within two weeks of the first rehearsal, by November 8th, 2025.

THINGS YOU WILL NEED TO SUPPLY/PURCHASE IF CAST:

- **Footwear:** Those cast may need to provide their own shoes and will be guided by the costume designer as to type/style.
- **Makeup:** For hygienic reasons, all cast members will need to supply their own basic makeup as guided by the makeup designer. TAP will supply any necessary specialty makeup.
- **TAP Membership:** All cast members are required to become members of the organization. Information about joining TAP will be provided by the TAP Board at the first read-through.

FIRST REHEARSAL:

The first rehearsal for *Peter and the Starcatcher* is tentatively scheduled for the night of **October 28th, 2025.** At this rehearsal, we will conduct the first readthrough, introduce the production team, distribute relevant materials, complete costume measurements & headshots for the program (additional details will be provided if you are cast), along with several administrative items that will need to be addressed at that time.

Peter and the Starcatcher Character Breakdowns

CASTING NOTE:

TAP & the *Peter and the Starcatcher* Production Team value diversity in race, disability, gender, sexuality, socio-economic background, faith, and age, so casting will start from this position and will always be open and neutral. Everyone is welcome and warmly encouraged to attend auditions. This play takes place in a fictional world, and as such, there are no racial/ethnic restrictions on casting. The character descriptions indicate the age that the character should appear onstage, but do not need to match the age of the performer. That said, please note that for this production, all roles are only open to performers who are 18+.

CHARACTER BREAKDOWNS:

(Note: Some roles include multiple characters)

Boy: (M, 18-30) A nameless and friendless 13 year-old orphan, deeply mistrustful of adults and neglected. Actor must read young, regardless of actual age. This role involves intimacy choreography.

Molly Aster: (F, 18-30) A 13 year-old apprentice Starcatcher desperate to prove herself to her father. Highly intelligent and physically adept, she remains socially awkward and something of a know-it-all, very competitive (think Hermione Granger from *Harry Potter*). Actor must read young, regardless of actual age. This role involves intimacy choreography.

Black Stache: (M, 30-50) A highly intelligent but malapropism-prone pirate chief. Stache is given to scenery chewing and anachronistic jokes, and has a hook in his future (think Gaston from *Beauty and the Beast*).

Prentiss: (M, 18-30) One of the Boy's orphan companions. Pompous and sarcastic, but a coward when pressed. Actor must read young, regardless of actual age.

Ted: (M, 18-30) One of the Boy's orphan companions, nicknamed 'Tubby Ted'. Constantly hungry, he is obsessed with food. He accepts Molly as a mother figure immediately, often referring to her by that title. Actor must read young, regardless of actual age.

Smee: (M, 30s-50s) Black Stache's faithful first mate. More intelligent than he gives himself credit for (but still not overly bright), Smee is willing to follow his captain in any amount of hare-brained schemes.

Lord Leonard Aster: (M, 40s-60s) Molly's father, A Starcatcher on a secret mission for Queen Victoria. Paranoid and frequently puts country over family. Emotional.

Fighting Prawn: (Any gender, late 30s-early 50s) The fierce chief of the tribe of Mollusk Islanders. Also plays **Grempkin**, the sadistic schoolmaster of St. Norbert's Orphanage for Lost Boys, **Sanchez**, one of Black Stache's crew, and **Mack**, the world's most incompetent Sailor.

Mrs. Bumbrake: (M, late 30s-early 50s) Molly's faithful nanny, a prim and proper Englishwoman (must be able to play older and a bit fussy). Also plays **Teacher**, a wise and mysterious mermaid. Knowledge of Victorian-era deportment/etiquette a plus, but not required.

Alf: (M, mid-30s - early 50s) A salty and flatulent sailor on *The Neverland*, who falls deeply and instantly in love with Mrs. Bumbrake. He is good-natured, but somewhat coarse and has no time for children.

Bill Slank: (M, 40s-60s) The nasty, greedy, and cruel captain of *The Neverland*. Also portrays **Hawking Clam**, Fighting Prawn's son.

Captain Robert Falcon Scott: (M, 40s-60s) Captain of *The Wasp*, and Lord Aster's old friend from their schooldays.

Ensemble: (Any genders, 18+) cast portrays narrators, mermaids, pirates, sailors, islanders, and various other creatures, locations, and people throughout the show.
